PARA ANNOUNCES OPENING OF RESTROOM FACILITIES FOR 2009 SEASON

Tuscaloosa, Ala. - Most of the public restrooms managed by Tuscaloosa County Park & Recreation Authority are now open for the season. The restrooms will open and close in accordance with each respective location's scheduled operating hours.

The open facilities include those at Maple and Minnie Sellers shelters at Bowers Park, the Bowers Park Pool Complex, the Cherry and Magnolia shelters at Snow Hinton Park, Monnish Park, Shelby Park, Kentuck Park, the Mimosa and Walnut shelters in Palmore Park, the ball complex at Fosters Boat Landing and Willow Shelter, the Model Airfield and the north and south ball fields at Sokol Park.

Year-round facilities are located at Fosters Boat Landing, Sokol Park, Shelby Park, the Magnolia Shelter, the Maple Shelter and Bowers Park Pool Complex. The other locations typically open in March and close in December.

The restrooms at Evans-Roshell Park and Freeman Park are still under construction and will be opening soon.
